<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Protects from harm or threat of harm, threats, intimidation</u> • <u>Can last 6 months to indefinitely</u> • <u>Tailored to victim circumstances</u> • <u>Can include exclusion zones</u> • Can include children, schools, nurseries etc. • Application to Family Court • Family or civil proceedings • <u>Breach penalty max 5 years imprisonment & or a fine</u> 	<p>Determines occupancy of family/victim's home.</p> <p>Victim /Survivor can stay in the family home and perp removed.</p> <p>Can be obtained even if victim has no legal right to home.</p>	<p>Prohibits the taking or removing of a child from a parent's care or making decisions such as removing a child from school, changing their name or taking them out of the country.</p> <p>Parents, guardians or holders of a residence order can apply under S8 of the Children Act 1989.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <u>Protects from harm or threat of harm, threats, intimidation</u> • <u>Can last 6 months to indefinitely</u> • <u>Tailored to victim circumstances</u> • <u>Can include exclusion zones</u> • Can include electronic tagging or attendance to drug & alcohol, perp programmes, etc. • Perp has 3 days to report to local police station when served • Obtainable via civil and criminal courts • <u>Breach penalty max 5 years imprisonment & or a fine</u> • Can include measures to remove perp from family home.
